The way in which local Council Tax is set is in dire need of updating.

The present system is based solely on the property value and bears no relation to household income. Taxes are, or should, be based on the premise of ability to pay.

Council tax does not come within this premise. For example I have lived in my house for about 45 years and have now retired. The tax is now about 10% of my income whereas when I was working it was about 6%.

The only way for this tax to be fair is to base it on the individuals income. The original, so called, Poll tax made everybody pay equally for local services but it was condemned because it took no account of each person's income.

It should be possible for local councils to know the income of all it's residents and hence fix a percentage rate for the council tax. I am sure HMRC could easily find a way of informing the councils of the numbers required.

When we moved to this house the local council had two levels of rates. 1, the urban rate and 2, the rural rate which took into account the lack of amenities etc that the rural households had. The rural rate was approximately half the urban rate. This should be the situation now if the present system is to continue.

I hope this commission will treat this situation with consideration.
